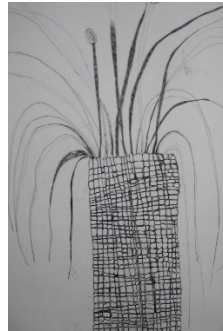

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

<b>Observational drawing</b>	To draw or paint something as accurately as possible.
<b>pattern</b>	A repeated decorative design.
<b>Blend</b>	When colours are slightly mixed together.
<b>line</b>	A mark made on a surface that joins different points.
<b>Form</b>	Objects that are 3-dimensional.
<b>sculpture</b>	the art of making two- or three-dimensional representative or abstract forms, especially by carving stone or wood or by casting metal or plaster.
<b>outline</b>	A line that marks the outer limits of an object or figure.
<b>sketch</b>	a rough drawing or painting in which an artist notes down his preliminary ideas for a work that will eventually be realized with greater precision and detail.



## Sticky knowledge.

- Henri Rousseau was born in Laval, France. He spent a lot of his life as a tax collector (collecting money from people) including some time as a soldier. Henri Rousseau only started painting seriously when he was in his forties. He taught himself to paint. He said that he had 'no teacher other than nature'.
- Oliveira was born in Lisbon, Portugal. (1980-Present) Portuguese  
His wire sculptures play tricks on your eyes because they look like drawings but they are 3 dimensional.
- Alexander Calder was born in Philadelphia, USA. He liked making sculptures that moved. Alexander Calder studied engineering at university. He often made his sculptures very small and then enlarged them.
