
Mathematics

Knowledge and Skills

- I can recognise the numbers 3, 4 & 5.
- I can count 3, 4 & 5 things from a larger group.
- I can recognise there are 3, 4 & 5 things there without having to count them.
- I can recognise and name a triangle, square, rectangle and pentagon.

Knowledge and Skills


- I can sing most of the rhymes from the Brentnall Poetry Curriculum, as well as others taught.
